

RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF SHERWOOD NO. 159

BYLAW NO. 02/15

A BYLAW FOR THE PURPOSE TO ASSIGN CIVIC ADDRESSES

WHEREAS the Council of the Rural Municipality of Sherwood No. 159 in the Province of Saskatchewan wishes to enact a bylaw to assign civic address numbers to multi lot subdivisions within the Rural Municipality;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Rural Municipality of Sherwood No. 159, in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

1. Short Title:

This Bylaw may be referred to as the Multi-Lot Address Bylaw;

2. Purpose and Intent:

This Bylaw is intended to:

- a. Identify that civic addresses are required for location purposes for identification;
- b. Provide for address requirements.

3. Definitions:

In this Bylaw:

- a. "Civic" relating to the municipality especially its administration.
- b. "Address" the particulars of the place where someone lives or an organization is situated, this consists of street address number, a street name, municipality name and postal code. The street name may include a street type and direction.
- c. "Street" means any public street, highway, road, lane, or bridge.
- d. "Civic Number" means the number assigned to a property by this Bylaw.
- e. "Owner" means the person assessed for the property.
- f. "Street Name" means the official name of a street and street type assigned to a street by this Bylaw.

4. Provisions

- a. The Rural Municipality of Sherwood will assign civic addresses for multi-lot subdivisions for identification purposes.
- b. All property owners shall keep posted on their buildings and/or property the assigned civic number.
- c. All civic address numbers shall be displayed on the front face of the building in a location which is not obstructed from view from the street.
- d. All civic address numbers shall only face towards the public street and not the provided road upon which the property is addressed.
- e. All civic address numbers shall be a minimum of 8" high with a maximum of 16" when displayed on the face of a building provided that the building is no more than 15 m from the property line.
- f. All civic address numbers shall have a contrasting colour on their background (i.e. white numbers on dark buildings or black numbers on light coloured buildings.)
- g. An owner shall not display on a property any number which is not the assigned civic number with the exception of a building number (i.e. A.B.C), or unit number (i.e. #1-203), or a number which is clearly part of a business name.
- h. Civic numbers shall face towards the street, the number shall be posted at the end of the access driveway when the building is more than 100 m from the property line and it shall be on a free standing post, gatepost, signpost, or other structure on the lot excluding utility poles for electrical, telephone, or other utility service poles and

shall be shall be a minimum of 8” high with a maximum of 16”. This address blade shall be reflective and shall be white numbers on a green background.

- i. No permit is required for the placement of civic address numbers.

5. This Bylaw rescinds Bylaw 32/13.

6. Coming into force

This Bylaw shall come into force and effect on the date of its final adoption.
